Discussion of EE 241 as corequisite/prerequisite for EE 242 (Makhsous)

In previous meetings, both in the ECE Undergraduate Core Courses Committee (UCCC) and quarterly hand-off meetings for EE 241 and EE 242, the issue of EE 241 being a corequisite for EE 242 rather than a prerequisite has been raised as a point of possible concern and in need of review.

- Some students have expressed concern with getting the material needed from EE 241 in time for use in EE 242.
- Students anecdotally appear to struggle a bit more when taking the courses concurrently.
- Syncing the two courses properly is difficult and leaves little room for flexibility.
- Two proposed solutions:
 - Revise EE 242 to require EE 241 as a prerequisite instead of its current status as a corequisite.
 - Allow for teaching both courses in the same quarter by the same instructor and to count as 2 teaching loads.
 - Currently, teaching 3 quarters of EE 241 counts as one teaching load.
 - The common way faculty teach EE 241 does not involve attending all lab sections for the full time.
 - Attending every lab section for the full time would require about 15 hours per week.
 - Generally, lab sections are led by a TA, with the instructor coordinating the content and overseeing the TAs.
 - Instructor will attend parts of lab sections from time to time.
- Discussion arose regarding the amount of content to be covered in 242, with some faculty stating that some topics can only be very briefly covered, if at all.
 - Some preferred reverting back to the previous structure of EE 235/341 which separated continuous and discrete topics.
 - Arabshahi said the issue had been discussed when the revision to EE 241/242 was approved as the desire was to have all students have at least an introduction to the discrete material, thus requiring both be covered in the core class.
- Shepard noted that, of all the courses in the core, only EE 242 was dependent on another core course.
- The committee members agreed getting data on grades for taking the courses concurrently versus taking EE 241 prior to EE 242 would be good to know before making a decision.

 Action Item: Overly will provide Makhsous with data to assess the grade impact of taking EE 241 and EE 242 concurrently versus taking EE 241 prior to EE 242.

Proposal to add EE 215 as corequisite for EE 280

Now in the middle of teaching EE 280 for the first time, Wilson proposed adding EE 215 as a corequisite for EE 280 to provide students with important material to help make the topics covered in EE 280 more accessible for students.

- Wilson has noticed in her class that some students who have not yet taken EE 215 appear to struggle with the course.
- Van Fossen mentioned she has heard many students find having taken EE 215 helpful when taking EE 280.
- Makhsous wondered if adding as a corequisite would lead to similar issues as with 241 and 242.
- Hameed expressed concern that the material would not be covered soon enough in EE 215 to be beneficial in EE 280 since it can take a while for the material to "ramp up" at the beginning of a quarter in EE 215.
 - He believes it is a helpful class for EE 280, but he thought EE 215 may be better as a prerequisite instead of a corequisite.
- Wilson raised the issue that this would lengthen the prerequisite chain, and believed there were basically two options available:
 - o Add some needed material into EE 280
 - A problem is that EE 280 is already extremely material heavy, and adding more would be difficult to do well.
 - o Add EE 215 as a corequisite for EE 280.
 - Wilson stated she did not believe the timing of material would be an issue.
